A HURRICANE SWEPT SHIPPEGAN Hotel, and Old Building Destroyed and Other Damage

Shippegan, N. B., July 22.—(Special)—A storm of unusual severity struck this village about 2.30 a week ago on Thursday afternoon. The wind which had assumed the proportions of a hurricane, was accompanied by a real cloud-burst, which, with hail, thunder and lightning, was anything but pleasant to behold. Never before, in the memory of the oldest inhabitants, had such a storm been witnessed here. Much damage was done in the village and vicinity. A large hotel in course of construction here belonging to Mr. J. A. Robichaud, was completely demolished. Mr. Robichaud estimates his loss at \$10,000.00. An old mill situated back of the Robichaud Hotel was blown down, and one side of the roof carried some distance. Many windows were broken. Fish houses and freezers on the wharf suffered some damage. Trees were uprooted, wagons overturned. Pieces of debris were hurled by the force of the wind, some being sent clean into the houses through the windows. A large boat was lifted up from the shore and carried up some distance. Very little damage was done to the fishing craft. Across the river from here, a large barn was destroyed and several other buildings more or less damaged.
