MONTREAL, Oct. 23.—The returns of the health office show 38 deaths from smallpox in the city yesterday, 3 in Cote St. Louis, 1 in St. Jean Baptiste, 1 in St. Gabriel, 1 in St. Ceneude, and 2 in St. Roch.

It was stated that in response to the appeal to the citizens for co-operation in the various branches of work connected with the epidemic, the Canadian Red Cross and one resident of Boston have offered their services.
