Barley—About 1500 bushels marketed. Quotations range from 35c to 48c according to quality.

Oats—The 200 bushels brought in about satisfied the demand. There is no change in figures from yesterday. While A1 loads realize 32c, prices may be quoted at from 30½c to 32c.

Peas—The only load offered realized 54c. Inferior qualities are worth 52c.

Dressed Hogs—Previous quotations were maintained with a fair supply. General figures paid were \$5.80 to \$6. Heavy will not command more than \$5.25 to \$5.50 and choice butchers' light \$5.50 to \$6.

Hay—Most of the offerings to flay were wet, and while farmers preferred to sell by the load buyers were not chary of buying that way. The offerings were limited. Choice timothy is quoted at \$10 to \$12, with clover from \$5 to \$9 per ton.

Straw—The market rules steady, with average delivery at \$6 to \$7.

To-day's market was a considerable improvement on Monday. The active demand for eggs which has been manifest of late shows no signs of abatement, and as high as 17c per dozen was paid for fresh-laid eggs to-day, with the general price ranging from 15c to 16c. Butter in the rolls is worth from 22c to 23c, with 25c asked for choice qualities in some instances. Large rolls command 17c to 20c. There is no change in the prices of vegetables, potatoes being quoted at 60c to 65c in quantities and 65c to 70c by the single bag. Vegetables are in steady demand at Saturday's quotations. Apples are worth from \$2 to \$3 per barrel, but consequent upon liberal supplies in the face of only a fair demand it is only in rare instances that as high as \$3 is paid. There is little change in the fish market, although more varieties are on sale. Pickerel is worth 8c, white fish from Niagara \$1 per dozen, salmon trout 7c to 8c, Winnipeg white fish 10c per pound, herrings 25c and 60c per dozen, each complain of a dull trade with nipeg white fish 10c per pound, herrings 25c and 50c per dozen. Provision dealers complain of a dull trade with quotations nominally the same. The small supplies of good qualities of butter have resulted in maintaining previous high prices, large rolls being quoted at 17c to 19c and dairy tub about the same, with 20c realized for selections. Eggs are unchanged at 15c to 16c for fresh and 12½c for limed. Trout and whitefish bring 6½c to 7c per pound.


