White beaus \$1.35 to \$1.50. Evaporated apples, \$56 to 9e; dried, 5e to 556.

Cattle—A few choice exporters were picked up at 334c to 444c. The animals for which there was anything like a demand averaged 1300 to 1400 pounds. Butchers' cattle were off about \$3' per head. Demand poor. Good heifers weighing 1050 to 1150 pounds found purchasers at 34cc, while inferior stuff running from \$50 to 900 pounds sold down to 25c. There was a falling off in the supply of good cattle. Stockers were not wanted for export, the boats being late. A few big animals were picked up for the States here at about 35c. firm prices. Bulls averaging 1200 pounds were bought at 25¢ to 25¢.

Caives—Demand fair and supplies equal to it; animals ranging from 100 to 180 pounds sold at \$4 to \$8 live weight.

Sheep and Lamos—Shipping sheep dull and weak at \$5 per head; those taken were principally for breeding purposes. Butchers' animals sold at \$4. Lambs dui and weak at \$5 to \$4; about 300 were left over.


