the longitude pointed out by the watch was  $2^{\circ} 8' 38'' \frac{1}{2}$  too far to the West; that is, it had lost, since our leaving Queen Charlotte's Sound, of its then rate of going,  $8' 34'' \frac{1}{2}$ . This was in about five months, or rather more, during which time it had passed through the extremes of cold and heat. It was judged that half this error arose after we left Easter Island; by which it appeared that it went better in the cold than in the hot climates.
