WASHING TON.

Ma. Entros,-In order to reach New York by railway, I was obliged to cross the Hudson to Greenbush, (which possibly some of the readers of the se papers, who were taken prisoners by the Americans and imprisoned in that pitiful place, may not forget,) for the road now in the course of construction on the eastern side of the Hudson is completed only as far from New York as Poukeernie. From Greenbush we travelled the Buston road till we had crossed over into Masarchusetta, a distance of thirty-right miles. This road passes through Rensselaer and Columbia counties, but chiefly through the former. In these counties, and in those on the western branch of the river, the Van Rennelser family own a tract of land twenty-four miles In length and twenty-four miles in depth. This was granted to their ancestor, one of the earliest Dutch settlers in the county, when it was a wilderness, but now it is a princely domain. In the southern part of Columbia county the Livingstone family have a similar tract, though not to the same extent, and in Dutchess county the Courtland family had a similar tract .--These were let out to settlers, at an early day, at a mere nominal rent of a bushel of wheat, or a few fonts. or a capon or two a-year, together with some other more valuable privileges to the lords of the manor, amongst which was a tenth of the purchase money on every purchase. Of late years, however, when these rente and tenths had fallen very much into arrears, and the landlords attempted to press the tenants for them, they were resolutely opposed, the officers of justice resisted by persons calling themselves " Indiens," and disguised so as to appear like them, and some two or three prisoners, amongst whom was an under cheriffekilled by these lawless men. However. as the tenants had about 30,000 votes, and as they were sufficient to turn the scale in the election to whichever side, whether Democratic or Whig, they gave their votes, they have not been very severely dealt with, and probably will, in the end, he able to throw off the claims of the landlords altogether .-There can be no question that, in this county at least, the feeling prevails very strongly against holding land under such a tenure, which is but a remnant of the In it found to the language to desprise their rights, which have been theirs since the first settlement of the country?" Soon after leaving Greenbush, the care pass through

a deep excavation in the wild rocks, and the way in which the rock dips to the south-east is very remarkable. Further on you pass through a long tunnel, excavated, I believe, through the solid rocks. This is a part of the Green Mountains, which stretch from Lower Canada through Vermont into Connecticut, in a line nearly parallel with the Hudson, to no great distance from the Atlantic. The first place of any note you pass, after entering Massachusetts, is Weststockbridge, celebrated for the Stockbridge Indiana, who formerly inhabited this part of the country, and their apostolic missionary, John Elliott. The country here is rough and billy, and apparently barren, but it is far otherwise as you approach the beautiful villages of Great Barrington and Sheffield, on the Housatonee river. The country around appears like a well entitvated garden, studded with fruit trees, and showing from the appearance of the houses and tenements, that plenty, industry and good management are no strangers bers. There do not appear to be many manufacturers at Great Barrington, though there are a few at Sheffield; but from what I could see and learn from an intelligent gentleman, whom I took the liberty of asking for information on the subject, I learned that at these two places there are settled a good many persons of considerable means, who, occupying a few acres, cultivate their land to the highest state of perfeetion, and thus live in peace, comfort and plenty ---There is a degree of public spirit and taste about the American villages at the north, which we would do well to cultivate, more than I have ever yet known it to be done in Canada.
