Page 38, section 38, paragraph 1, line 1, should read: "Canada feels that the new instrument could include a recognition of the role of the community in dealing with some health issues."

Page 41, section 42, paragraph 2, Canada also noted that the ILO <u>Convention 169</u> provides that adequate procedures be established within the national legal system to resolve land claims. Canada has several land claim processes to deal with indigenous land claims, including a comprehensive land claims process to deal with claims to traditional territories.

Finally, the submission from the Inuit Tapirisat of Canada suggests that other indigenous groups have significant comments also which would be of great interest to the Organization of American States membership. Such comments could be reflected in greater detail in the summaries on indigenous comments.
