

PREAMBLE (cont'd)

Export Procedures - Peanut Butter

A) Exports to the United States

An individual Export Permit is required for each shipment of peanut butter exported to or trans-shipping through the United States. Peanut Butter is defined as goods that are classified under tariff item No. 2008.11.10 of Schedule I of the Customs Tariff. Please see page G-1 of Section G and Notice to Exporters, serial no. 81 dated January 13, 1995 for more information on the export of peanut butter to the United States.

B) Exports to countries other than the United States

There are no quantitative restrictions on the exportation of peanut butter to countries other than the United States. Individual export permits are not required but exporters wishing to export peanut butter to countries other than the United States have to invoke, at no cost, the General Export Permit No. EX31.

Export Procedures: Sugar-containing products

An export permit is required for exports to the United States of sugar-containing products, described in Chapter 17 of the Harmonized Tariff Schedule of the United States (HTSUS). Please see page G-2 of Section G and Notices to Exporters, serial nos. 82 and 84 for more information.

Export Procedures: Certain sugars, syrups and molasses

An export permit is required for exports to the United States of sugar-containing products, described in Chapter 17 of the Harmonized Tariff Schedule of the United States (HTSUS). Please see page G-3 of Section G for more information.

How to obtain a permit/certificate of eligibility

Requests for permits/certificates will be accepted 30 days prior to the expected date arrival/exit of the shipment. When requesting a permit/certificate applicants should complete form EXT-1466 (95/06) "Application for Permit" and transmit it to EICB or to an on-line customs broker.
