## PRAYERS.

Mr. McIntosh, seconded by Mr. Millar, by leave of the House, introduced Bill C-69, An Act to amend the Civil Service Act (Bureaucratic Oppression), which was read the first time and ordered for a second reading at the next sitting of the House.

The following Questions were made Orders for Returns under the provisions of Standing Order 39(4):

Question No. 192, by Mr. Berger,—Order of the House for a Return showing: 1. Did talks take place this year between officials of Canada, the United States, and British Columbia, or between officials of any of them, regarding the sale to the United States of the downstream benefits which Canada would acquire under the Columbia River Treaty and, if so, did these talks cover the question of what price or prices would be paid for said downstream benefits?

2. Has the government reached agreement with the Province of British Columbia as regards the sale, on a long-term basis, of downstream benefits under the Columbia River Treaty, to the United States?

\*Question No. 207, by Mr. Rinfret,—Order of the House for a Return showing: 1. What are the addresses of the various offices of the Canadian Broadcasting Corporation in Montreal?

2. How many of these offices are rented?

3. What is the total monthly rent paid for the said offices?

Mr. Halpenny, a Member of the Queen's Privy Council, presented,—Return to the foregoing Order.
