On motion of Mr. Pickersgill, seconded by Mr. Gordon, it was ordered,—That the Items listed in the Main Estimates and the Supplementary Estimates (A) and (D) for 1963-64, relating to the Department of Veterans Affairs, presented to this House at the present session, be withdrawn from the Committee of Supply and referred to the Standing Committee on Veterans Affairs, saving always the powers of the Committee of Supply in relation to the voting of public monies.
