

THE HOUSE OF COMMONS OF CANADA.

BILL 202.

An Act respecting a certain trade convention between His Majesty and the President of the Czechoslovak Republic.

HIS Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Senate and House of Commons of Canada, enacts as follows:—

Short title.

1. This Act may be cited as *The Czechoslovak Convention Act, 1928.*

Convention approved.

2. The convention of the fifteenth day of March, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-eight, entered into at Ottawa by plenipotentiaries appointed by His Majesty and by the President of the Czechoslovak Republic, copy of which is set forth in the schedule of this Act, is hereby approved.

Extension of advantage to the Czechoslovak Republic.

3. After the said convention is brought into force, and so long as it remains in force, articles the produce or manufacture of the Czechoslovak Republic which are imported into Canada shall be admitted into Canada on the most favourable terms granted to any foreign power.

Orders in Council authorized.

4. The Governor in Council may make such orders and regulations as are deemed necessary to carry out the provisions and intent of this Act and of the said convention.

Suspension of inconsistent laws.

5. The operation of all laws inconsistent with the giving to the provisions of the said convention and of this Act their full effect shall from time to time be suspended to the extent of such inconsistency.
