

rock on the west coast of British Columbia. This rock is a menace to both Canadian and American boats going to Alaska and the northern ports of British Columbia. For many years representations have been made urging that the rock be removed, and I understand the department have had their engineers investigating with a view to ascertaining the cost and recommending the removal of the rock.

Mr. STEWART (Leeds): Mr. Chairman, I do not wish to interrupt the hon. gentleman, but it does occur to me that as we are dealing with public buildings at the present moment, the proper time to discuss Ripple Rock would be when we are considering the items for harbours and rivers, and when probably I would have more information available.

Mr. GARLAND (Bow River): Is it the general policy of departments to erect public buildings under other departments than that of public works?

Mr. STEWART (Leeds): There are other departments that to a certain extent construct buildings for themselves. I have in mind the Department of Justice, and the Department of the Interior as far as Indian affairs are concerned.

Mr. GARLAND (Bow River): I think we should put them all under the minister and give him some more work.
