tric power export that has occurred in this house. Therefore let us not have any more of that. We know now, and we are quite prepared to quote back to any hon. member in that corner, the views he has already expressed in this debate bearing on the export of . waterpower resources of Canada. To be sure members' day, but all hon. members know of their views may be of some value to others in the long pull, but not to me. This debate has been almost entirely away from the point and has covered matters not discussed on the supply. introduction of the bill, and not referred to in the bill itself.
