farmers to protect them against low prices. We have never fully regained the markets we lost then in Europe.

While I think the long term prospects for grain marketing are good, the present prospects are not as good. We are going to have to be very careful and very sharp in this country to prevent further deterioration, particularly if we are going to convince the United States that price cutting will harm us all and may wreck the international wheat agreement which has been negotiated. I certainly hope this will not be the case.
