TREE NURSERY AT INDIAN HEAD, SASKATCHEWAN

Question No. 3,147-Mr. Hnatyshyn:

1. With regard to the tree nursery at Indian Head, Saskatchewan, did the government make a contribution to this operation and, if so, in what amount for (a) 1972 (b) 1973 (c) 1974 (d) first 6 months of 1975?

2. What was the income from this operation for the same years and what was the source?

Hon. Marcel Lessard (Minister of Regional Economic Expansion): The answer for the Department of Regional Economic Expansion is as follows: 1. Contributions of the federal government toward operational costs (Operations and Maintenance plus Capital) of the Indian Head Tree Nursery are as follows:

DETAILS OF BUDGETARY REDUCTION MENTIONED IN PRESIDENT OF TREASURY BOARD SPEECH IN HOUSE

Question No. 3,170—Mr. Reynolds:

1. With reference to the President of the Treasury Board's speech in the House on July 2, 1975, what are the details of the budgetary reduction of (a) \$13 million for the Department of the Environment (b) \$5 million for the Ministry of State for Urban Affairs (c) \$18 million for Central Mortgage and Housing Corporation (d) \$4 million for the Department of the Solicitor General (e) \$4 million for the Royal Canadian Mounted Police (f) \$6 million for the National Harbours Board?

2. Will the Minister advise what are the miscellaneous items totalling \$41 million as stated in his speech of July 2, 1975?

Hon. Jean Chrétien (President of the Treasury Board): Ministers were given discretion to choose alternatives as long as they maintained the same total. The items are now expected to be as follows: 1 (a) \$13 million for the Department of Environment: Salmon enhancement program, \$4.0 million; Additional resources for fleet operations, \$3.4 million; Ocean policy implementation, \$2.0 million; Public service staffing delegation, \$1.1 million; Flood mapping, \$1.0 million; Development of pollution abatement technology, 1.0 million; Acquaculture—fish farming, 5 million. (b) \$5 million for the Ministry of State for Urban Affairs: Urban demonstration projects, \$4.0 million; Reduction in operating expenditures, \$1.0 million. (c) \$18 million for Central Mortgage and Housing Corporation: Neighbourhood improvement and residential rehabilitation program,
