principle that is being established here this afternoon is that this is an interventionist Government which is prepared to intervene in the market-place. I am glad that that is being put on the record today. In fact, it is in the interest of letting the Government put this on the record that I will take my seat.

Mr. Gray (Windsor West): Mr. Speaker, I have a question for the Hon. Member. Does he not realize that this Bill would not be proceeding now without the full agreement of the House Leader on his behalf and that of his Party? I hope he will not talk about sneaking this Bill into the House. Second, does he not realize that when speaking of the Government as being an interventionist Government, he is giving intervention a very bad name?

Mr. Rodriguez: Mr. Speaker, yes, we wanted the Bill to come before the House and we wanted it to come before the House for a reason. We want to see a vote and we want the Tories and the Liberals to vote together for this interventionist

Mr. Speaker: Is the House ready for the question?
