I hope he will not talk about sneaking this Bill into the House. Second, does he not realize that when speaking of the Government as being an interventionist Government, he is giving intervention a very bad name?

Mr. Rodriguez: Mr. Speaker, yes, we wanted the Bill to come before the House and we wanted it to come before the House for a reason. We want to see a vote and we want the Tories and the Liberals to vote together for this interventionist Bill.

Mr. Speaker: Is the House ready for the question?
