in order to have competition, but there is no real competition in the wholesale and retail price of gasoline. Four companies, including Petro-Canada, control the market and have been keeping the price up because they are surviving and making a little money. The poor oil companies in Alberta, the little Canadian oil companies who do not have retail markets like this, are suffering and will be gobbled up by these big fellows who are making all that money in Halifax.

I am glad the Hon. Member brought this up because, as I said in my speech, this is a country in search of a new energy policy. However, we are simply not getting it. This document addresses itself to what the Hon. Member for Cape Breton-The Sydneys, who is very familiar with this subject, has called a bit of a fantasy. There is nothing happening in the frontier, but this is the kind of Bill we are getting and the Government is ignoring the real problem.

SPEECH FROM THE THRONE

RESUMPTION OF DEBATE ON ADDRESS IN REPLY

eliminate the unfairness, the complexity and the unaccountability of the present system".
