of fowls and ducks being brought for the fhip's ftore, the greatest part of them prefently died : this spread a general alarm on board, it being apprehended that they had been killed by poifon : but on examination it appeared, that it was only owing to their being crammed with stones and gravel to increase their weight; the quantity thus forced into most of the ducks being found to amount to ten ounces in each! The hogs too, which were bought ready killed of the Chinese butchers, had water injected into them for the fame purpose; so that a carcase, hung up all night that the water might drain from it, had loft above And when, to avoid this a stone of its weight. cheat, the hogs were bought alive, it was difcovered, that the Chinele gave them falt to increase their thirst, and having thus excited them to drink great quantities of water, they then took measures to prevent them from discharging it again by urine, and fold the tortured animal in this inflated flate. When the commodore first put to fea from Macao, they practifed an artifice of another kind; for as the Chinefe never fcruple eating any animal that dies of itfelf, they contrived, by fome fecret practices, that great part of his live fea-store should die in a short time after it was put on board, hoping to make a fecond profit of the dead carcafes which they expected would be thrown over-board; and two third of the hogs dying before the Centurion was out of fight of land, many of the Chinese boats followed her, to pick up the carrion. These instances may serve as a specimen of the manners of this celebrated nation. But to return :

The commodore, toward the end of September, having found out (as has been faid) that those who had contracted to fupply-him with fea-provisions and ftores, had deceived him, and that the viceroy had not invited him to an interview, according to his promife; he faw it would be impossible for him to furmount the difficulties he was under, without going to Canton, and visiting the viceroy.
