WASHINGTON, June 22.—The supreme court today reversed the commerce court, and upheld the intermountain rate order of the interstate commerce commission.

The intermountain rate order was issued in June and July, 1911, by the interstate commerce commission under authority of the "long and short haul section" of the Interstate Commerce Act.
