POSTSCRIPT.

We have been favored with a New-York paper of the 12th February, containing extracts from Glasgow papers to the 4th January. These extracts represent the situation of Great-Britain as flourishing beyond example: the 3 per Cents had risen in consequence, to 73 S. 1-4. The Parliament had adjourned to the 3d February.

The Report of the change in the title of the French Consul, is given in a private letter from Paris: the Senate was sitting on some important affair, and the creating Bonaparte Emperor of the Gauls and Cisalpine Republic, was generally believed would be the result. In a conference with the Swiss deputies, on the 12th Decr. Bonaparte told them that they must enter into no alliance with England; and he said the only way for them to become truly great, would be by becoming 3 departments of France. It is confidentially stated, that the Floridas have also been ceded to France, in return for the Duchies of Parma and Guastalla. Reinforcements to the amount of 20,000 men were to be sent to St. Domingo: 6 Battalions of Infantry several detachment of Cavalry and of Artillery were embarked at Helvothuy's for Louifbann; and the Officers of the Civil Government were to sail at the same time.

His Majesty's forces were still in possession of Malta and Egypt.
