support the Government—that their motives are not bigotry, not monopoly, not any unchristian or unmanly spirit, but simply a love of liberty, and a well-grounded fear that it is in danger—let US especially, my friends, meet, unite, encourage and know each other—and contribute liberally—for I tell you, that, to carry on our objects, liberal contribution is indispensible; and lastly, let us adhere to our plans and principles—promulgate sound political doctrines—correct misrepresentations—awe outrageous violences—redress the victims of persecution—abstain from every thing of injury—exercise eminently the spirit of charity, especially to our Roman Catholic countrymen, and thus maintain the characters which should peculiarly be ours—the illustrious characters of loyalty, of legality, and of universal benevolene.
