CHAP. I.

GENERAL VIEW OF THE COUNTRY.

THE circumstance of the conquest of Canada from the French, in the year 1759, is so recent, and appears so frequently to have been represented to the public, that to dwell on that period would be an useless consumption of time, both to the writer and the reader.
