EXPORT CATTLE ADVANCING.

The price of export cattle is showing a much firmer tendency both in Canada and in the States. British quotations for the best American cattle are now as high as 12 1.4c a lb., dressed weight, or fully a cent a pound higher tham this time a year ago. The condition of the British markets has shown a marked improvement during the last few months, which can only be accounted for by a lessened supply reaching these markets. Commenting on the advance in the Chicago market, The Drovers' Journal of that city attributes the home advance to a shortage in good cattle. This has been brought about by heavy marketing last season. The high price of corn and other cereals disposed farmers to sell their grains rather than feed them, the current price of cattle at that time not warranting them in keeping such heavy feed lots. A sinilar reason might be assigned for local conditions.

Ontario produce has ruled at an abnormally high price of late, the result of which has already been witnessed by the big advance in the price of hogs. From the immediate outlook the prospect for a higher range in the price of good cattle is promising, and farmers may with advantage allow their present stocks of feeders to put on further flesh before turning them into the market. Prices on the local market for exporters this week are 25c to 35c per cwt. higher than a week ago.
