The Committee on Farllamentary and Po-litical Action then presented its report, which regretted that the Legislature of Ontario, in which province the plebiscite carried by 82,000 of a majority, failed to support several measures of progressive leg-islation urged at the last session of the Legislature.

The committee urged that prohibitionist electors who have party affiliations be pre-sent in the local caucuses of their parties in order to secure such prohibitionist re-presentation in the county nominating con-ventions as shall secure known and avowed prohibition candidates for Parliament. Another recommendation was that no can-didate, however satisfactory his pledges may be, should be endorsed or supported unless his past record has been such as to show that his support may be counted upon on this question.
