In politics Mr. Murphy was a Conservative, and contested North York with Sheriff Widdifield, being defeated by the narrowest majority that had been given for years in this Grit riding. In private life he was known by his numerous riends by the high Ideals of honor and integrity which characterized his daily conduct in his social and business relations with his fellow men. Kind-heartdand generous to a fault, he will long be remembered as one of the highest types of manhood. 


