New York, July 24.—District Attorney Jerome returned from his summer home at Lakeville to-day and immediately began his promised investigation of the affairs of the Equitable Life Assurance Society.

"I went to the Equitable building to meet Mr. Harriman, as I understood that he was going away to-morrow, and I desired to see the much-talked-of Union Pacific preferred stock agreement.

The syndicate agreement was one of the terms of which would have at any time been a part of the investigation of the superintendent of insurance.

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ARNOLD-FORSTER'S ARMY REFORM IS TAUNTED FROM ALL SIDES

Pitiable Position of British War Secretary—Gives Assurances of Satisfactory Conditions, But Can't Argue the Question.

New York, July 24.—L. N. Ford writes The Tribune from London, as follows: Englishmen have faith in Lord Roberts as a practical soldier.

At the outbreak of the Boer war, and that the reserves are not adequate for the maintenance of a fighting force of equal strength in a similar emergency, his word is accepted as authority that is unimpeachable.

The various schemes of military reorganization introduced by Mr. Arnold-Forster are not understood when there is a conflict of expert testimony respecting their utility, but whatever may be the estimate on paper or the sophistries of debate on the subject, what is necessary as a safeguard for the British Empire, it is not a conscript army, but a system of organized reserves, which will keep the country prepared for a military crisis.

One of the best English traits is candor, and there is no lack of it in discussion of military policy. Mistakes are made in the preparations and equipment for the Boer war, but the whole system was serviceable, and the reserves were not exhausted.
