

# FRANK GILL, THE WINNER FEATURING AT BRIGHTON

Hessian, Favorite, is Second, and Gold Lady Third—Results and Entries.

NEW YORK, July 11.—Frank Gill, running to his best form, easily won the Brighton Handicap, 110 to 1, a quarter of 1000 persons.
