Directions and Instructions for Telegraphing Fire Alarms.—Keys are left with the occupants of buildings in the vicinity of each fire alarm box. The members of the police force also possess keys. The following will be observed when a fire is discovered: Go to the box, open the door and pull the hook down as far as it will go, firmly and without jerking, and let it slide back; if the alarm is not immediately heard upon the small bell within, or upon the tower bells, go to the next nearest box and repeat the operation. Key holders are cautioned not to open the box except in case of fire; to not give an alarm till certain of a fire; to not give an alarm for a fire seen at a distance; to pull down the hook but once in giving an alarm; to not let the key go out of their possession except when demanded by proper authority.
