**PLANS GREAT CUT**  
OF PULPWOOD  
Great quantities of four-foot pulp  
wood are to be cut in Maine this sum-  
mer, one concern having advertised for  
7,500 men to work on the Penobscot and  
Kennebec rivers and along the line of  
the Bangor & Aroostook Railroad, get-  
ting out 20,000,000 feet, or about 40,000  
cords. Although this work commands  
the highest wages ever paid in the  
Maine woods, it is for some reason dif-  
ficult to get native loggers to engage in  
it. The labor markets of New England  
and New York are scoured for any  
kind of help, and even the commonest  
of foreign labor is hard to get. A fair-  
ly good worker can make \$60 to \$80 a  
month saving these short logs, and by  
working overtime in the long days of  
summer a smart sawyer can earn as  
high as \$120 a month, or even more, ac-  
cording to the paymasters. For the driv-  
ing of this four-foot stuff, also, fore-  
igners are about the only help obtainable.  
Most of the pulp and paper concerns in  
Maine made their usual cut of long  
logs and short pulp wood last winter,  
but the needs of the mills are such that  
operations must be continued all sum-

### PERSHING TELLS HIS MEN HE WANTS GOOD BEHAVIOR

Commander of Yankees Issues  
General Order in Which He  
Says Fair Name of U. S. Must  
be Guarded

Major General Pershing, commander  
of the American forces in France has  
issued the following general order to  
his troops:

"The first time in history an Amer-  
ican army finds itself in European  
territory. The good name of the Unit-  
ed States and the honor of the Ameri-  
can flag are at stake. The main ten-  
ance of cordial relations require the  
perfect deportment of each member of  
this command.

"It is of the gravest importance that  
the soldiers of the American army  
shall at all times treat the French peo-  
ple, and especially the women, with the  
greatest courtesy and consideration.  
The valiant deeds of the French armies  
and their women by which they have  
gathered successfully maintained the  
common cause for three years, and the  
sacrifices of the civil population of  
France in support of their armies com-  
mand our profound respect. This can  
best be expressed in the part of our  
forces by uniform courtesies to all the  
French people and by the faithful ob-  
servance of their laws and customs.

"The intense cultivation of the soil  
in France under conditions caused by  
the war makes it necessary that ex-  
tra care be taken to do no damage to  
private property.

"The French manhood capable  
of bearing arms is in the field  
fighting the enemy and it should there-  
fore be a point of honor to each mem-  
ber of the American army to avoid do-  
ing the least damage to any property  
in France. Such conduct is much more  
representative of the honor of the  
United States than the actions of those  
of our own country."

### GOING OUT OF FASHION

The Human Race Not Inclined to  
Walking These Days

When the bicycle was at the height  
of its popularity one of the comic pa-  
pers had a squib in which a neighbor  
was represented as asking of a five-  
year-old, "Can your baby sister walk  
yet, Johnnie?" "Walk?" responded  
Johnnie, scornfully, "I should say not.  
She can't even ride a bicycle yet."

It did seem for a time as if the hu-  
man race might be inclined to abandon  
itself of traveling on its own feet and  
taking entirely to wheels. Walking  
seemed in danger of becoming a lost  
art. Nor does there appear to have  
been much of a revival of it. The bi-  
cycle is less popular than it was, but it  
is still with us, and other means of  
locomotion have been added. We travel  
by bicycle and by automobile, on  
roller skates and in flying machines. Oc-  
casionally the more daring of us essay  
a trip behind a horse, and every auto-  
mobile is at the spectacle. But the prac-  
tice of going for a walk seems to have  
been relegated to the limbo of things that  
were.

And yet, walking is good. The doc-  
tors tell us it is good for one's health.  
Undertaken in the right frame of mind,  
and with the right surroundings, it is  
certainly good for the spirit. Try it  
early in the morning, at sunrise, while  
the air is chill and the sky gray. brisk  
motion is needed to keep up the cir-  
culation. The air is clean and still, for  
the wind has not yet risen. Silence  
reigns in the woods. The light grows  
stronger and faint twitters are heard  
as birds begin to rouse themselves from  
their sleep. The air grows warmer, and  
about in search of food for their hun-  
gry broods, and the air is filled with a  
medley of song. And which one walks  
out on such a morning, with a clear  
conscience and after a good night's  
sleep, he will return home with an ap-  
petite which may re-kind him force-  
fully of the high cost of living, but  
with the conviction that life is worth  
living, no matter what the cost.—Grand
