Canadian Clubs and Red Cross Societies are sending for canned fruit—not jam—to send to our boys in the trenches. This good work should be encouraged and "every lady in the land" should put down an extra supply. The Red Cross Society will furnish glass jars (for this purpose only), at 25c. a dozen, including carrying case.

GERMAN NAVY IN GULF OF RIGA

Russian Squadron Offers Battle to Protect Coast—The Result Still in Doubt

Petrograd, Aug. 20, via London, Aug. 21—A German fleet has penetrated the Gulf of Riga and is engaged with Russian warships defending the coast, according to an official statement issued tonight at the Russian war office.

The communication follows: "Strong forces of the German fleet have penetrated the Gulf of Riga, and fighting with our ships continues. "On land, on the whole front, from the west of Riga to the Lower Bilia, there has been no essential change. After the occupation of the Kovno fortifications by the Germans the remainder of the garrison rejoined our forces, occupying positions west of the railway from Kovno to Konevskaya, south of Kovno. Our troops still are on the left bank of the Niemen.

"From Ososvets southward, and still further along the whole front of the Upper Narva and the Bug, in the course of the 18th and 19th, the Russians made strong attacks. On the right bank of the Narva, in the region of Strenkova and Gostin in the Stralia-Bleek sector, near Lipaita, thirteen miles northwest of Druat-Livork in the sectors attacked, our troops continue to withstand the enemy. Our cavalry assisted in repulsing a German offensive near Linnar, attacking the German infantry in strong forces.

"On the Bug, the enemy, having occupied the right bank of the river since the morning of the 19th, directed his ulterior efforts along the road leading to Pashkova.

"Near Novogorodsk, after occupying the left bank of the Kura, the Germans concentrated all their efforts north-west of the Wilna, as far as the Vistula. By an incessant bombardment with a hurricane of projectiles they almost completely destroyed our fortifications. In this section on the evening of the 18th the Germans surrounded one fort in the region of Wymoslaw and afterwards, despite enormous losses, directed their columns on the rear of the Zakroczyn sector. This compelled our troops on the left bank of the Kura, and the former forts forming the central defense. In the course of the following day, having destroyed by their fire two of these forts, the Germans, by a series of sanguinary assaults, occupied their ruins, from which they directed their fire against the central defenses. We blew up the bridge over the Narva, and the forts we abandoned in the northern sector."

A powerful German fleet has been attempting, since August 8, to force an entrance into the Gulf of Riga, which would permit them to give assistance to their army, which occupies the western coast of the gulf. The Russian official statement indicates that they have accomplished their purpose, probably penetrating through the Dirben Channel, which is the only practicable way for large ships to enter the gulf.

The Russians asserted that their warships and seaplanes were successful on the 8th in repulsing nine German battleships and 12 cruisers, with a large number of torpedo boat destroyers. The Germans asserted this attack merely was a reconnaissance to determine the position of Russian submarines.

A German admiralty statement issued August 11, said that German cruisers drove off Russian torp-no boats which appeared near the entrance of the gulf the preceding day, in spite of repeated attacks by Russian submarines.

A Petrograd official statement, issued this morning, admitted that Russian warships, protecting the entrance to the gulf had drawn in closer owing to the great superiority of the enemy's fleet.
