#### EXPLOSION WRECKS

##### NEW YORK HOUSE

Five People Slightly Hurt and Eight Horses are Buried.

New York, Aug. 11.—The tug Clarence Rowland overturned in the harbor early today following an explosion, and several of her crew were reported killed. The accident occurred off Port Richmond, Staten Island.

Police boats picked up the captain and two of the crew. The captain said the crew consisted of seven.

#### FINANCING IN DOMINION

Toronto, Aug. 11.—New Canadian financing by governments, corporations and railroads since the beginning of the year and up to August 8 has reached a total of \$280,570,401, according to the records compiled by A. E. Ames & Co., Toronto.

The totals are as follows:—  
Government, federal and provincial, \$167,170,000.  
Municipal, \$50,759,501.  
Corporation, \$50,181,000.  
Railroad, \$12,560,900.

Included in this total is the \$100,000,000 issue sold by the federal government in the New York market.

Totals by months are as follows: January, \$27,520,361; February, \$16,408,000; March, \$36,453,888; April, \$18,946,487.

#### SOCIAL DISEASE RIFE IN TORONTO

Toronto, Aug. 11.—Starting figures with reference to the prevalence of social diseases in Toronto are given by Dr. Charles J. Hastings, minister of health, in a health bulletin. In calling upon the citizens of Toronto to face the facts in regard to the ravages of venereal disease, he deprecates the fact that false modesty in connection with such matters has involved a penalty of mortality exceeding even that of cancer or tuberculosis.

"We have in Toronto six venereal disease clinics," says the report "endeavoring to cure, or shall I say control, the infectivity of diseases that never should have occurred."

#### NEW MEMBERS OF STAFF AT MCGILL

Montreal, Aug. 11.—Additions to the instructional staff in Arts of McGill University were announced yesterday following a meeting of the governors of the university. The new officers of instruction are Prof. W. T. Waugh, B. D., named associate professor of history; Prof. C. A. Dawson, Ph. D., graduate of Acadia, named assistant professor of sociology and director of social service; H. R. De Silva, A. M., named lecturer in psychology, and Miss Margaret Pickle, named assistant in English in the Royal Victoria College.
