



LLOYD GEORGE ON HOME RULE BILL

Answers Criticism of Mr. Asquith - Very Optimistic of

Result of Bill.

London, March 31—Continuing his criticism in the house of commons today of former Premier Asquith's plan for the solution of the Irish question. Premier Lloyd George asserted that no one had accepted the plan of former Premier Asquith. Dealing with the suggestion of John R. Clynes, Labor, for a constituent assembly the premier emphasized that the previous Irish convention had failed and asked if it was likely that the assembly proposed by Mr. Clynes

because it recognized the fact that the house would not satisfy Irish opinion in its present state without destroying the essential unity of the kingdom. The demand in Ireland for the moment was for independence and secession and no self-government. Lloyd George said he wanted to say to "our American friends" that Eamonn DeValera was putting forward the same claim in exactly the same way as Jefferson Davis and that some of the men who voted for the Irish self-determination motion in the senate the other day had ancestors who fought to the death against changing to the Southern States of America.

The acceptance of that demand, declared the premier, would never come. It was a demand which, if persisted in, he said, would lead to exactly the same measures of repression as in the case of the Southern States of America. Great Britain, he declared, claimed nothing more than the United States had claimed

for themselves. Great Britain, he added, would stand on its own legs.

There were certain powers which might be conferred upon Ireland when she settled down to an established union and accepted partnership with the United Kingdom, said the premier, but if they were given at the present they would only be wasted, to the harm of the union and of herself. It would be placing dangerous weapons in the hands of an infuriated people, he declared. The premier concluded by saying he believed the bill would result in bringing about the union of the north and the south, union with Protestants and Catholics, union with Great Britain and Ireland.

Butter Coloring For Coloring Winter Butter

and Oleomargarine DIRECTIONS FOR USE: Put the butter or oleomargarine in a bowl and drop on it for each pound ten drops from the bottle of coloring.

If using the capsules, pierce one of these and squeeze contents over the butter. Work the butter with a spoon (a large wooden one is best), mixing color in thoroughly, and in a minute you will find it the color of June grass butter. Do not heat the butter before mixing; but if it is left in a warm room for a while before mixing it will color more easily.


