TEST OPEN AIR SCHOOL ROOMS
Boston Likely to Have Them After Results Found in Brookline

Boston, Oct. 26.—Open-air schoolrooms, that are being tried in Boston and some surrounding towns, have given a great success, tests in Brookline have shown. The tests, conducted by Dr. H. Lincoln Chase, chief medical inspector, and Dr. Walter Channing, chairman of the Brookline School Board's Committee on Hygiene, show the following results:

After eight months the "fresh air" children showed an average gain in weight of 3.18 pounds, and of 1.08 inches in height, as compared to the 2.09 pound and .85 inch gain of children of a typical classroom in the Winthrop school.

Boston may soon have more of these open-air schoolrooms. Chairman Charles Logue, of the Boston Schoolhouse Commission, is greatly in favor of the new type of schoolroom, and believes that at least two of these open-air classrooms should be installed in every school building.
