BRITAIN'S CANAL PROTEST IS PRESENTED TO KNOX

Washington, Dec. 9.—Great Britain's formal note of protest against the section of the Panama canal act which exempts American coastwise shipping from paying tolls for passing through the Panama canal, was presented to the secretary of state, Philander C. Knox, tonight by the British ambassador, James Bryce, who read the note word for word to the secretary at the latter's home.

To Resist American Claims

In addition to supporting these points by long arguments, Earl Grey indicated that any strong resistance will be met with on refund tolls on all American shipping using the canal, the same objection probably would apply to the coastwise trade shipping, in view of the probable impossibility of framing regulations that would result in a preference to American shipping.

Secretary Knox listens attentively to the reading of the note and promised to take the matter under careful consideration, which he felt would require some time. It has been strongly intimated in official circles, however, that it was the president's intention to settle this important question before closing his administration by recommending that the senate agree to the proposed amendments, or preferably by the more direct means of an agreement between the two nations referred to in today's British note.
