## **ACTIVE OPERATIONS** ALL WINTER IN CAPE BRETON MINES Kidney Disease and Gravel Caused

Dominion Coal Company Plan To Raise More Than Half a Million Tons

The Glace Bay Gazette says that the Dominion Coal Company's collieries will be operated all winter to a greater extent than ever has been the case in that season. Last winter they banked above 400,000 tons; this winter it will be more than half a million tons.

The principal reason for the continuation of summer productions during the coming winter is the fact that the company has in former years found great difficulty and considerable loss in reorganizing its working force in the spring. The company now has in its employ more than 10,000 men, and in order to keep this trained and effective force upon its pay rolls, and do away with the mobilization of another force in the spring, it is intended to operate its mines continually, during the winter, except when prevented from long so by storms.


