MAY IT PLEASE YOUR EXCELLENCY:

We, the Ministers and Elders of the Presbyterian Church of Canada, in connection with the Church of Scotland, in Synod assembled, embrace this first opportunity of conveying to Your Excellency our congratulations on Your assuming the Government of the pritish North American Provinces, and our wishes for Your welfare and prosperity.

We rejoice that a Nobleman, who, we have reason to believe, is deeply convinced of the incalculable benefits secured to Scotland by education and religion, has been selected by our Gracious Sovereign to represent Her in this part of Her dominions. From the situation in which we are placed, we have ample opportunities of judging of the intellectual and moral condition of the inhabitants of this Province, and have frequent reason to regret that a country so highly favoured in regard to natural resources should be so greatly deficient in the means of mental and religious cultivation. We confidently hope, that to supply this want will be one great object of Your Excellency's Administration, since nothing is more evident than that the best laws prove ineffectual, unless sustained by the moral feeling and intelligence of the people.

That Almighty God may long spare Your Excellency's life, and direct you by His counsel, and give success to all Your efforts to promote the welfare of the country, is our fervent and constant prayer.
