The revenue amounted to \$52, 561, 834, an increase of \$5, 561, 113 over the same time last year. There was an in-crease in the expenditure of over one mil-lion dollars, making a net betterment of \$4,752,464. The capitalization was \$6,371, \$851, a decrease of <math>\$5, 298, 707, compared with the ten months last year. The state-ment for the month of April shows an in-crease of four and a half million in revenue and an increase of about a guarter of a million in expenditure.
