FOR THE PREVENTION OF STRIKES.

The strike in Cape Breton has continued for several weeks, and that which began yesterday at Springhill shows the utter futility of the Lemieux act of 1907 to aid in the prevention and settlement of strikes, and "lockouts in coal mines and industries connected with "public utilities." In both strikes some of the matters involved have never been investigated or referred to arbitration. The purpose of the Lemieux act was to prevent a strike without investigation. But the strikes begin and go on in utter disregard of, and contempt for, the law.
