THE BETTER FARMING TRAIN STARTS TODAY

Will Make Tour of the Province for Demonstration Purposes.

TWO COACHES WITH VARIED EXHIBITS

Experts will Make Tour to Lecture on Subjects of Import to Farmers—Over C. P. R. Line First.

Fredericton, July 15.—The Better Farming Coaches opened for inspection at the C.P.R. station this morning, prior to their tour of C.P.R. lines in New Brunswick.

There are two cars, one containing exhibits of live stock and the other exhibits of dairy products, horticulture, poultry and other branches of agriculture. The exhibit of this year surpasses that of last year's "Better Farming Special," being a more extensive one.

The grain exhibit is particularly fine, and shows results due to the various dates of seeding and the benefits derived from early seeding. The exhibits also show the influence of the selection of seed on the yield.

The exhibit of dairy products is one of the best in the car. The insulated tank for keeping cream and the cooling tank for milk show the advisability of keeping milk or cream at a low temperature, whether for use as cream and milk or to be used in the making of cheese products, etc.

The exhibit of horticulture, showing the results of cultivation, illustrating the importance of protecting agricultural work in New Brunswick.

The entomology exhibit, various insects in the different stages are shown. There is a large collection of insects, some of which are from Wm. McIntosh of St. John, who is the head of this department.

With assistants from the Provincial Department of Horticulture, fifty injurious weeds, with their seeds, are also on exhibition. There are special exhibits of insects, some of which are the different growths from three months to one year, spraying and pruning machinery is also on exhibition.

A number of living plant caterpillars are shown, the eggs of which have been kept in cold storage and are now hatched out. These are the insects that have been so injurious to the crops in New Brunswick.
