The marketing of the numerous "fake" English and other commodities thus produced by the German factories is effected through neutral countries. Germany has neighbors whose frontiers are guarded in a military sense, but whose commercial avenues are nevertheless open for the assistance of the Hun merchants and their hirelings.
