N.B.—It will be observed that there is an increase of 742 in the number of full and socredited Mambers in the Missions under the immediate direction of the Missionary Committee and an apparent decrease in the other Missions. The decrease, however, is only apparent and not real; it is occasioned by the formation into regular Circuits of some of the Domestic Missions in Canada, occasioned by their advancing prosperity, and their ceasing to be counted among the Missions.

2. In consequence of the advance of civilization, and as the result of the influence of Missions, printing establishments are formed in almost every Colony, which have randered it unnecessary for the Committee te multiply those under the care and direction of the Society.
