Sarnia's Big Vision.

Big things are planned for Sarnia during the coming year by the Chamber of Commerce which was recently formed, and which has a membership of more than six hundred. The directors have outlined the plans in general and these include great improvement strides in education, industrial activities, water front improvements, good roads, radials, and nearly everything else that will improve or boom the city. The dues from the membership amount to about \$10,000 per year, and this will be spent on the work. The Chamber will secure the services of an expert man to boom the city and as it is willing to pay a good price to the proper class of manager, it is likely that one of the best will be secured. Results are already being seen.

Say Fares are too Low.

The London Street Railway Company will suspend all improvements, including the paving of streets unless an increase in fares is granted by the City Council, it was announced by the President, Charles Currie of Akron, Ohio. The company claims to be operating at a loss. Its application for increased rates was refused last year, and is before the Council again. The purchasing of the road and its operation as a public utility are under consideration.

Has Secured St. Catherine's Figures.

Assessment Commissioner M. Huenergard has received a statement of assessment in the City of St. Catherine's. The population of that City is 19189. Comparative figures for St. Catherine's and this city are: Total assessment, St. Catherine's, \$17,226,885, this city \$14,091,393, total assessment liable for all taxes, St. Catherine's \$14,347,800 and this city \$12,403,646.

Income assessment, \$1,107,925, St. Catherine's and \$445,187. For business assessment this city's figures are \$1,255,890 as compared to \$1,064,500, the Commissioner stated Mr. Huenergard is of the opinion that an increase in the local assessment should be made.
