

An increased demand by the public for information regarding land settlement is attributed partly to the fact that Crown lands in Western Canada within fifteen miles of a railway, which heretofore have been reserved for returned men, breame available for civilian entry

on 1st May.
Besides Crown lands that may be available, it is estimated that there are about 200,000 quarter sections of privately owned lands lying idle in the Prairie provinces, most of them within easy reach of railways-The same condition applies, though in a lesser degree, to the older provinces of Canada. This condition is not, however, due to lack of value in the land itself on the contrary and particularly in the Prairia provinces, much of this idle land is rich virgin soil-for when one considers Canada's vast land area and


