B. at Quebec, 3 Aug., 1825. Ed. in Classics at the Coll. of Ste. Anne's, Quebec, and in medicine at McGill Univ., Montreal. M. in 1851, Charlotte Mary, dau. of Thos. Chase of Detroit, Mich., formerly of Quebec, who died 18 Mar., 1886. Began to practice in Detroit in 1851, but removed to Sandwich in 1856. Is Coroner and Jail Surgeon for Essex. Was Capt. of the Sandwich Co. V.M., and subsequently surgeon to the troops stationed at Windsor and Sarnia during the Fenian raids in 1861 to 1864. Was for two years mem. of the Municipal Council of Windsor, and has been a mem. of the Board of Education for 18 years. Was elected first Presdt. of the St. Jean Baptiste Soc. of Essex in 1864; General Presdt. of all the French Socs. of Essex in 1883, and as such presided at the French-Canadian Convention held at Windsor in 1883. Created a Knight of the Order of the Holy Sepulchre in 1884. Is a brother of the Abbé H.R. Casgrain and of P. B. Casgrain, M.P. for L'Islet, and father of T. C. Casgrain, M. P. P., Quebec. Called to the Senate, 12 Jan., 1887. A Liberal Conservative.—*Windsor, Ont.*

CHAFFERS, *Lieut. Col., Hon.* WILLIAM HENRY. (*Rougemont.*)

S. of the late Lieut. Col. William U. Chaffers, Catherine H. Blanchette; and grands. of W. Chaffers, Esq., M.D., of Liverpool, Eng. B. in Quebec, 2 Aug., 1827. Ed. at Chambly and Montreal. M., 1840, Louise, dau. of the late James O'Leary, Esq., M.D., formerly a surgeon in H.M. service (she d. 1870). A merchant. Has been Warden of Rouville, Mayor of St. Cesaire, a Commr. of Small Causes, and Presdt. of the Rouville Agricultural Soc. Sat for Rouville in Can. Assem., from Oct., 1856, till g. e., 1857, when he retired. Represented Rougemont in L. C., Can., from Jan., 1864, until the Union. Called to the Senate by Royal Proclamation, May, 1867. CLEMOW, *Hon.* FRANCIS.

S. of Capt. John Clemow, an officer in H.M. 41st Regt., who was severely wounded at the battle of Queenston Heights. B. at Three Rivers, P.Q., 4 May, 1821. Ed at U. C. Coll., Toronto.
