20. The holder of a mineral claim shall be entitled to all Holder of a minerals, the property of the Crown, which may lie within his mineral claim entitled to. claim, but he shall not be entitled to mine outside the boundary lines of his claim continued vertically downwards.

21. These Regulations shall not prejudice the rights of Not prejudice claim-owners nor claim-holders whose claims have been located under other under former Regulations. regulations.

22. No mineral claim shall be recorded without the applica- Application. tion being accompanied by an affidavit or solemn declaration made by the applicant on Form "A" of these Regulations, or if it be a fractional claim in the Form "A1."

23. Provided that the failure on the part of the locator of a Failure to mineral claim to comply with any of the foregoing provisions necessarily shall not be deemed to invalidate such leasting if shall not be deemed to invalidate such location, if upon the invalidate facts it shall appear to the satisfaction of the Mining Recorder location. facts it shall appear to the satisfaction of the Mining Recorder that such locator has actually discovered mineral in place on said location, and that there has been on his part a bona fide attempt to comply with the provisions of these Regulations, and that the non-observance of the formalities hereinbefore referred to is not of a character calculated to mislead other persons desiring to locate claims in the vicinity.

24. Any location made upon Sunday or any public holiday Location shall not for that reason be invalid.

25. The Minister of the Interior may grant a location for Location of the mining of iron and mica, not exceeding 160 acres in area, which shall be bounded by due north and south and east and west lines, and its breadth and length shall be equal. Provided that should any Free Miner making any application purporting to be for the purpose of mining iron or mica, thus obtain, whether in good faith or fraudulently, possession of a valuable mineral deposit other than iron or mica, his right in such deposit shall be restricted to the area hereinbefore prescribed for other minerals, and the rest of the location shall thereupon revert to the Crown for such disposition as the Minister may direct.

25a. (1.) The Minister of the Interior may grant locations Copper. for the mining of copper in the Yukon District; each location to consist of an area not exceeding one hundred and sixty The boundary lines of each location Order in acres in a square block. shall be due North and South and due East and West, and not Sept., 1898. more than one area shall be granted to any one person within a district of ten miles. The grant of such location for the mining of copper shall not give to the grantee any rights to any other minerals, except minerals that are combined or Order in mixed with copper or copper ore, and in no case shall include Jan., 1899. free milling gold or silver.

(2.) There shall be paid to the Government on the gross Order in outpout of copper from any such location a royalty to be fixed Sept., 1898. by the Minister of the Interior, not exceeding five per cent on such gross output.

(3.) The Minister of the Interior may make such rules and Order in Council, 12th regulations and impose such conditions for ensuring the deve- Sept., 1898.
