ENTICED INTO SLAVERY.

Iwankee Detectives Report on the Traffic in Girls for Immoral Purposes. MILWAUKEE, Jan. 4 .- The Mayor, Chief of lies and detectives are conferring to dev ethods of putting a stop to what the autho Ities call a traffic in girls. The report of the that in the vicinity of Hurley, Ironwood, Beasemer, Marinette, Menominee and other lumbering and mining towns are what are termed dance-houses; that the inmates of these houses are usually young girls, as making less trouble to the propretors; that the inmates are furnished by men in Milwaukee and Chicago, who are paid a certain sum for each; that the inmates are virtually prisoners, their clothing being taken from the mand they being kept in debt to the proprietors so that they are unable to leave the places. One of these victims, Florence West, aged 16, was returned to her widowed mother in this city to-day by two detectives detailed for that purpose. The officers went to Bessemer Wednesday morning, finding that a Milwaukee man had telegraphed Jack Boardman, keeper of the dance house near that place, and warning him to get rid of the girl. Early yesterday morning the West girl and another Milwaukee girl. Anna Winkelman, were taken to a house near Hurley. The detectives then proceeded to Ironwood and Hurley, a distance of eight miles, visiting eight dance houses. Each house contained from four to twelve girls between the ages of 14 and 18 years. The West girl was found in the house at Hurley and was auxious to return home.

To Chief Ries, this afternoon, Miss West said she was induced to leave her home in this city four months ago by a west-side salcon-keeper. She went to Bessemer and thence to Jack Boardman's dance-house. Her-clothes were taken from her and she was dressed in short dresses, and was not permitted to leave the place or to communicate with her friends. By a system of fines she was kept in debt to the proprietor, who refused to surrender her glothing until she had paid him what he claimed was due him.
