Dr. Tenny observed that he would like to enderse the views expressed by the Hon. Commissioner for China. He was of opinion that the Commission would be justly blamed if the Delegates were to separate without having presented their views on this matter. When the motion was put to the Commission on the previous occasion, sufficient thought had not been given to it, and perhaps the vote taken then did not express the mature judgment of the House. If it were necessary to bring the motion before the House again, he would propose that a roll call be taken in recording the vote upon this question.

Men. Ratard having suggested that a written copy of the resolution be handed to each Delegation in order that they might have time to consider same, and that the vote be taken in two or three days time, Dr. Tenny proposed that the futher consideration of the resolution be the first business for the next session.

This met with the approval of the House.

The Commission adjourned at noon until the 19th February at 10.30 a.m.
