Dear Senator Meighen,

I am in receipt of your letter of the 31st ultimo in which you make inquiry regarding buffalo skins for making into a coat for one of your sons.

We keep a stock of dressed buffalo skins here at 71 Bank Street, Ottawa, suitable for coat purposes and would be glad to have you call at your convenience and make a personal selection. If this is not convenient we would be glad, if you so desire, to make a selection for you.

The price of first grade dressed buffalo skins is \$25.00 each. One skin is large enough to make a coat for an average sized man. However, where two coats are wanted we recommend three skins as this enables the furrier to eliminate all the heavier parts of the skins.

I might add we are expecting a new shipment from the fur dressers shortly and I would suggest that by waiting for these skins a better selection could be made.
