No improvements have been made on the lot for which he applies, and only one instalment has been paid thereon. He is therefore not entitled to a Settler's License.

2. As to Mr Lawrence's application, Mr Lawrence is entitled to a License to cut timber in clearing land for cultivation, and to sell the timber on which dues or a tariff should be collected to be credited in payment of the purchase money upon evidence being given that the land on which the timber has been cut is being cleared.

3. Mr Ward is entitled to a Settler's License on the lot applied for by him upon evidence similar to that required from Mr Lawrence being
